### A Historic Gathering in New York

The **United Nations General Assembly (UNGA)** remains the world's largest diplomatic stage, where global leaders meet annually to address humanity's greatest challenges.

This year's assembly, held from **September 22–29**, **2025**, was unlike any other — commemorating the **80th anniversary of the United Nations** and reflecting on eight decades of global service, cooperation, and transformation.

#### 80 Years of the United Nations: A Call to Action


- Marking 80 years of existence, the UN's anniversary served as both a celebration and a reminder of
  its vital role in shaping a better world.
   The milestone emphasized:
- Listening to people's voices
- Reaffirming commitments to cooperation
- Promoting environmental and social responsibility
- Empowering youth and future generations
- Choosing collaboration over division
- W UN Achievements Over Eight Decades
- From peacekeeping to poverty reduction, the UN and its agencies have made measurable global impact:
- Peacekeeping: Deployed missions maintaining peace in conflict zones
- WHO: Controlled pandemics and reduced child mortality
- UNESCO: Advanced education, science, and culture
- UNICEF: Improved global child welfare and education
- WFP: Delivered food assistance to millions in crisis
- IOM: Facilitated safe migration
- UNHCR: Protected and resettled refugees globally

- A Ongoing Global Challenges
- Despite progress, several urgent challenges persist:
- Persistent poverty affecting millions

- Rising maternal mortality rates
- Increasing violence in conflict regions
- Educational inequality
- The widening digital divide
- The escalating climate crisis
- Keforming the UN: Building for the Future
- The 2025 Assembly underscored the urgent need for reform.

A working group was established to explore proposals, especially Security Council reform, ensuring greater inclusivity and responsiveness to global realities.

Key reform priorities include:

- Strengthening leadership accountability
- Promoting climate justice and sustainable development
- Ensuring education for peace
- Building a fairer, more inclusive multilateral system
- The UN's Vision for the Future
- Looking ahead, the UN envisions a world built on:
- Justice and equality
- Amplified voices of youth and marginalized groups
- Peace, solidarity, and human dignity
- Collective responsibility for a sustainable planet



## Renewed Commitment to Humanity

- The 2025 UNGA concluded with renewed optimism and a united global spirit. In his closing address, **Secretary-General António Guterres** declared:
- "No matter the challenge, no matter the obstacle, no matter the hour we will overcome. Because in a world of many choices, there are choices we must never make: the choice to give up. We must never give up."
- Leaders reaffirmed key global priorities:
- Securing \$100 billion annually for climate financing
- Advancing responsible AI for peace and development
- Supporting education as the ultimate equalizer
- Upholding the two-state solution for lasting peace between Israel and Palestine
- Reinforcing multilateralism as the foundation of a united humanity
